

What Levels of Universities Are Available in the United States?

University Levels

SOME BASICS

In the United States, institutions of higher education are known as colleges and universities. Students gain admission by submitting an application, and each institution has its own level of selectivity, requirements and admission standards. Colleges and universities may award degrees at the associate, bachelor, master and doctoral levels. Degree offerings vary by institution. Differences among them include the type of institution (liberal arts; public or private), the size of enrollment, cost and location

Community or Junior College

PROGRAM

Two-year Associate degree, often in preparation for a specific career or vocation.

Upon completing their course of study, community and junior college students often apply to transfer to a four-year university to complete their Bachelor's degree. Most institutions accept many of the credits earned at the community college level, especially if there is an articulation agreement between the two.

Attending a community college for two years and then completing a Bachelor's degree at a university can be a cost-effective way for you to obtain a university degree in the U.S.

Four-year Bachelor's degree in a specific course of study (major).

Types of U.S. Institutions of Higher Education

One of the advantages of studying in the U.S. is the variety of offerings open to you. While every school has its unique characteristics, the majority of four-year colleges and universities fall into three main categories:

Liberal Arts Colleges

A liberal arts college places primary emphasis on undergraduate study and offers exposure to a wide range of academic subjects, from the sciences to the humanities. Its curriculum is intended to foster general knowledge and develop students' overall intellectual capacities, rather than prepare them for a specific profession.

Liberal arts colleges can be either public or private.

Public Universities

Public universities, often referred to as state universities, receive most of their funding from the state and/or federal government, although tuition revenue and private funding also contribute to their support. Faculty research grants offer tremendous research opportunities for students.

In general, public universities cost less than private ones, and often have statewide admission requirements.

Private Universities

Unlike public universities, private universities receive no governmental financial support, but instead are funded through alumni donations, faculty research grants and tuition fees.

Technological resources, research facilities and small class sizes are major reasons students choose them.

Planning Your Studies in the United States

Here is your Blueprint!

► STEP 1: Create a Timeline

• Know Your Application Submission Deadline

You must submit your complete application package with all original documents as required for your major and degree to our University Admission Services (UAS) office in Princeton, New Jersey, at least six weeks prior to the university deadline date.

Select Your ELS Center

UAS Conditional Admission applications must be submitted with a selected ELS Language Center and ELS start date.

• Plan Ahead for Your University Start Date

Most universities encourage you to finish ELS levels a month or two prior to the start of your university study. Please note: conditional admission requires a minimum of three months of study in the ELS Language Centers English for Academic Purposes program, and additional study may be required depending on your English level placement and progress through your program.

Please include these considerations in your application timeline to allow for a smooth transition to university campus life.

Avoid Deferrals

In some cases, deferrals are not permitted or may require additional review and/or a new application.

► STEP 2: Prepare Your UAS Application Materials

Complete Your University Admission Application

An ELS authorized Counselor will help you complete the ELS UAS University Admission Application.

• Pay Your University Admission Services Fee

The University Admission Services fee includes the application process for one* ELS University Conditional Admission Network (UCAN) partner, UAS processing fees, courier fees for handling documents and UAS-to-University communication follow-up.

Determine if You Need a Third-Party Transcript Evaluation

Your ELS authorized Counselor will advise you if the university to which you would like to apply requires credential evaluation. In most cases, only an additional set of sealed transcript(s) and graduation certificate(s) are needed

There is a fee for this service.

Please consult your ELS authorized Counselor to see if your intended major and degree require a third-party transcript evaluation.

^{*}Additional university applications will be processed at additional cost.



► STEP 3: Gather Your Supporting Documents

Sealed Transcripts

Official, original, sealed transcripts and graduation certificate in English – one set per institution to which you will apply.

First-year undergraduate applicants: secondary school transcript and graduation certificate.

Transfer undergraduate applicants: secondary school and university transcripts.

Graduate applicants: university transcript(s) and graduation certificate(s).

Unsealed transcripts

An unsealed copy of each transcript and graduation certificate is required for ELS to verify that your GPA meets the university minimum.

Bank Statement

Official bank statement issued within the last six months with bearer's name in English and balance in U.S. currency. An original document is required for each university application.

Financial Statement

Original Financial Statement signed by student and sponsor (final page of the application).

Essay

Statement of purpose or admission essay.

• Sealed Letter(s) of Recommendation

Signed, sealed and labeled in English with student's name and recommender's name.

Undergraduate applicants: one recommendation per school.

Graduate applicants: three recommendations per school.

- CV/résumé
- Copy of passport picture page
- Copy of test scores (ELS certificate, GRE®, GMAT®, SAT®/ACT®, TOEFL®, IELTS™, etc.), if applicable. Official score results must also be reported to the university to which you will apply.
- Additional documents as necessary (e.g., portfolio, audition).

Your ELS authorized Counselor will submit your University Admission Services application online and express mail your original required documents for a complete application to the ELS office in Princeton, New Jersey.

We will be in contact with the university admissions decision-makers and notify your Counselor immediately upon receipt of your university's decision.

U.S. College Rankings - What do they mean? How can you use them?

In the United States, there is no "official" ranking list of the top 10, 20, 50 or even 100 U.S. universities. However, each year numerous magazines and guidebooks are published that contain college rankings and comparisons. These published rankings, although unofficial, are often used by students as a great starting point in deciding which university to attend. With more than 4,400 colleges and universities in the United States, keep in mind that it is admirable for a college or university to be recognized in any of the published rankings.

These American ranking publications utilize a wide variety of standards and methodologies to assess and compare the thousands of American colleges and universities. Some use more objective academic benchmarks (such as student standardized test score data) and others rely on subjective feedback (such as student and staff survey results), depending on the area of the university being compared. Some ranking publications focus on the general academic competitiveness and strengths of educational institutions, while other publications spotlight only a specific area for comparison, such as comparing professor and university administration accessibility.

For example, *U.S. News & World Report's* Graduate Business School Ratings Methodology uses ratings gathered from deans and directors of accredited master's programs in business, corporate recruiters, employment statistics of graduates, starting salary success, GRE® and GMAT® score mean averages, acceptance rates, and so on. *The Fiske Guide to Colleges* staff members select 300 of the most interesting and well-known colleges and universities. They send opinion surveys to administrators at those colleges, who distribute them to current university students. These surveys gather subjective information on a variety of topics, including professor and college administration accessibility, social life, academics, and quality of life.

Each ranking system and publication has its own criteria, standards, varied use of fact and opinion, and methods of gathering information. Compare these criteria to your own personal study goals. Your college life will consist of many experiences, and a ranking index is only one of several tools that help you find the school that meets your academic and social needs.

Core Classes
