




Something for everyone

Library

At the heart of the University of Leicester campus is the award-winning David Wilson Library – a stunning, light and airy five-storey building providing state-of-the-art services. Self-service loan and return, group study rooms, hundreds of PCs, wireless access, staffed Help Zones, 24-hour opening during term time, a bookshop and café all create a first-class study environment.

You can access over one million printed volumes and a digital library of over 350,000 eBooks, 30,000 eJournals and specialist information databases from anywhere you have an internet connection. The Library also has extensive collections of rare books and archives, ranging from the 12th to the 21st centuries.

Our librarians can provide detailed advice on finding and using information, and help you make the most of the resources available.

Accommodation

Studying in a new country is an exciting experience that will stay with you for life. Living together with other international students is one of the best ways to meet other people from different countries, make life-long friends and settle into university life.

Students at the International Study Centre can choose to live in newly-renovated student accommodation in St Georges Tower, or in a University of Leicester residence.

By living in St Georges Tower you will benefit from the convenience of living very close to our classrooms, and only a 20-minute walk away from the University of Leicester campus.

The rooms at St Georges Tower have been designed to a high specification. Each room has a television, Wi-Fi access, shower room, WC, and a kitchenette with a fridge, a cooker and a microwave.

St Georges Tower has a common room complete with television, vending machines, table tennis and other games. You can access this communal area on evenings and weekends to socialise, play games, catch up on TV shows and have fun with fellow residents.

As the accommodation is situated in a high-rise building, you will be able to enjoy beautiful panoramic views of the city. The reception at St Georges Tower is staffed 24/7 which means there is always someone available to assist you.

University accommodation



Opal Court

Opal Court is 500m from the main campus. There are 648 places available in a choice of room types, all of which have ensuite facilities.



Oadby Student Village

Oadby Student Village is located 3.5km away from the University. It offers a wide choice of accommodation and a vibrant social life next to the Botanical Gardens.



Nixon Court

Nixon Court is extremely popular due to its convenient location.
There are 979 self-catering, ensuite rooms at the site, which is divided into ten blocks.



Mary Gee Houses

Mary Gee Houses are 2km from the main campus. There are 36 houses, each with ten bedrooms, a bathroom, usually a shower room, and shared kitchen facilities. There is a common room on site.



Freemen's Common

Freemen's Common Houses' 304 self-catered rooms are situated 250m from the University campus. The accommodation is in purpose built houses, each with bedrooms plus shared bathroom and kitchen facilities.



Salisbury Houses

Salisbury Houses are 750m from the main campus. The converted houses with 122 rooms accommodate 10-27 students each. The houses have shared bathroom and kitchen facilities.



The International Foundation Year programme is designed to provide international students with a pathway to undergraduate degree study at the University of Leicester, a leading UK university with exceptional student satisfaction ratings.

The programme leads to a variety of degrees in related subject areas including business, computing, economics, engineering, mathematics, science and social sciences.

Study structure

You can choose one of four Foundation Year routes:

- Economics and Management
- Engineering and Technology
- Science
- Society and Culture

Course structure

During the Foundation Year you will undertake a combination of academic modules and English language and study skills classes, carefully designed to focus on the academic areas most relevant to your chosen degree.

The International Study Centre provides a universitystyle environment. During the programme, you'll participate in group lectures and seminars, and also undertake directed self-study.



Regular assessment

To ensure you make steady progress throughout the Foundation Year, we'll give you regular assessments. This includes exams, coursework assessment, presentations and extended essays.

English Language Preparation (ELP)

If you do not have the required level of English language to start the International Foundation Year, you can take our ELP course first. The course is designed to help you make good progress in each of the core English skills so that you develop a fully-rounded language proficiency.


You will need a minimum IELTS or equivalent score of 4.0 in all skills to start the ELP course.

What will I study?

The Foundation Year is carefully designed to provide you with a solid knowledge of your subject area combined with English language proficiency and the study skills you will need to succeed at university. Modules are taught by our experienced tutors who are all experts in their subject area.

Modules

English and Skills for Academic Study 1, 2 & 3

You will develop your English communication skills and learn a range of study skills, including: writing and reading strategies, presentation and seminar participation, organisation of time and materials, meeting deadlines and responding to feedback. You will then be able to use English language in your own academic work, give presentations and contribute to seminar discussions, take notes from lectures, plan and write well-structured academic essays.

Core Mathematics

You will study essential algebra skills, simultaneous equations, straight line equations, indices and logarithms, quadratics, differentiation, statistics and business maths.

Pure Mathematics 1*

You will study essential algebra skills, simultaneous equations, straight line equations, indices and logarithms, quadratics, differentiation, integration and trigonometry.

Business and the Modern Market Economy

You will study the operational and strategic problems facing business people in the modern market economy. You will focus on a wide range of issues, such as management, human resource practice, marketing and ethical aspects.

Economics 1

You will gain an understanding of economics systems, types of goods, allocation of resources, elasticity, price controls, types of markets, cost and revenue, economies of scale and market failure.

Globalisation and Global Issues

You will be introduced to the study and analysis of problems, issues and dynamics that have come to shape contemporary political life and society at the international, transnational and global levels. You will consider the causes and effects of globalisation.

Economics 2

You will look at aggregate demand and aggregate supply, economic policies, inflation, unemployment, international trade and development economics.

Introduction to Financial Accountancy

You will study double entry book-keeping, preparation of trial balances, profit and loss statements, depreciation, limited companies, manufacturing accounts and interpretation of accounts.

Project Study, including Computing (word-processing) Skills[‡]

You will complete a self-study project on a topic of your choice which relates to the degree programme that you will undertake.

*All Economics and Management students will study the Core Maths module and take the relevant Core Maths examinations. In addition, students who opt to choose a BSc degree in Banking and Finance, Business Economics, Economics or Financial Economics will also need to take a Pure Maths 1 examination. Students will be offered extra support to do this.

What will I study?

The Foundation Year is carefully designed to provide you with a solid knowledge of your subject area combined with English language proficiency and the study skills you will need to succeed at university. Modules are taught by our excellent tutors who are all experts in their subject area.

Modules

English and Skills for Academic Study 1, 2 & 3

You will develop your English communication skills and learn a range of study skills, including: writing and reading strategies, presentation and seminar participation, organisation of time and materials, meeting deadlines and responding to feedback. You will then be able to use English language in your own academic work, give presentations and contribute to seminar discussions, take notes from lectures, plan and write well-structured academic essays.

Pure Mathematics 1

You will study essential algebra skills, simultaneous equations, straight line equations, indices and logarithms, quadratics, differentiation, integration and trigonometry.

Pure Mathematics 2

You will look at further algebra, co-ordinate geometry, trigonometry, differentiation, integration, numerical methods and vectors.

Mechanics 1

You will study vectors, forces and equilibrium, relative motion, Newton's Laws of Motion, friction and work, energy and power.

Mechanics 2

You will continue your study of mechanics by examining advanced vectors, forces as fixed vectors, centres of gravity / centres of mass and particle dynamics.

Physics 1

You will concentrate on sound, reflection, refraction, interference, diffraction, electromagnetic waves, strengths of solids, fluids, heat and gases and the structure of the atom.

Physics 2

Modules

English and Skills for Academic Study 1, 2 & 3

You will develop your English communication skills and learn a range of study skills, including: writing and reading strategies, presentation and seminar participation, organisation of time and materials, meeting deadlines and responding to feedback. You will then be able to use English language in your own academic work, give presentations and contribute to seminar discussions, take notes from lectures, plan and write well-structured academic essays.

Pure Mathematics 1


